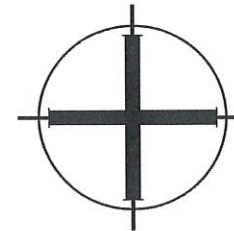

## *From our Congregation President*

It is truly a time to give thanks and give **thanks** to our members. Especially those that have filled our board and committee positions. Positions filled after the annual meeting are Vice-President – Rick Gilbertson, Council Secretary – Kim Erickson, Nominating Committee – Kathy Nelson, Carol Arthur, Barb Danielson, and Brad Nelson, and Audit Committee additions – Cheri Splinter and John Hendricks.

Also, **thank you** to our Stewardship board and all those that contributed to the shoe drive. A special thanks to Donna Liebaert for her wonderful leadership on this project!!!

We say **thank you** to our congregation for raising about \$59,000 for our new boiler system. During the boiler install it was found that a \$6,000 rework of the hot water systems and controls would improve efficacies. We moved forward with that improvement. Our hot water is now tied into the new boiler system. We are so **thankful** for the \$20,000 rebate we received for putting in the new, two boiler system. That money helped to pay for the rework of the hot water systems and controls. You may have noticed that we had been using throw-away cups during coffee hour. That hot water system is now also tied into the new boiler system. In the October council meeting, a motion was made and passed to remove the remaining old boiler and tie that system into our new boiler system, when we receive our rebate. This was decided because the new system is so much more energy efficient. This remaining old boiler heats the St. Paul area. All these changes are helping cut our energy costs. **Thank you**, Rick Gilbertson for overseeing these projects and keeping our building systems running smoothly!!! The boiler room looks great after some cleaning, painting, and organizing. **Thank you**, Gene Rosburg for building more storage and putting in counter tops. Take a minute to check it out.

Our fellow Lutheran churches have been confronted with some challenges. Pilgrim, Zion, and Bethel are meeting without Pastors. We also are the only church offering in-person Lenten services. So, we have extended an invitation to the other congregations, we hope they feel welcome at Our Savior's. I hope that when you see new faces at church, you will go out of your way to greet them and help to make them feel our gracious welcome. As our mission statement says, **"Our Savior's Lutheran Church celebrates with joy a life in Christ to be shared with others!"**

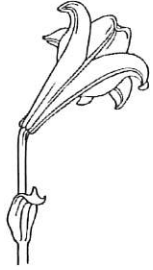

17. Do you think Jesus deserved to die on a cross? Why or why not?

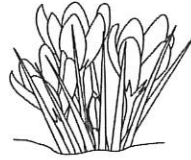

## OSLC Cooks



We have some great cooks here at OSLC and we'd like to feature some of your recipes. Where are all the recipes for the delicious food you all bring to church gatherings? If you're willing to share, you can drop them off in the box in the narthex or email them to

### Corn and Kielbasa Chowder (Racheal Ray)

8 Ounces Kielbasa, halved lengthwise and thinly sliced – use turkey kielbasa  
2 onions, finely chopped  
1 T butter or margarine  
1 14.5 oz can chicken broth (low sodium)  
1 large baking potato, peeled and cut into ½ inch cubes  
1 cup half and half (use milk or other low-fat substitute)  
1 # bag frozen corn  
Salt and pepper to taste  
Chopped fresh dill for garnish

Heat skillet or wide 4-6 qt pot over medium-high heat. Add Kielbasa and cook, stirring, until lightly browned, about 6 minutes. Transfer to plate.

Add the onions and butter to the pan and cook over medium heat, stirring occasionally, until golden, about 6 minutes. Add broth and potato and bring to a boil. Reduce the heat, cover with a lid and simmer until the potato is tender, about 10 minutes. Add the half and half (milk) and corn. Cook, stirring until heated through.

Using the blender or food processor, puree one cup chowder until smooth. Stir the puree back into the chowder along with the browned kielbasa and season

### Zuppa Toscana

Saute 4-6 pieces of bacon, chop and put aside.

Add 1 chopped onion to the bacon grease. Saute and set aside.

Cut 5 small potatoes lengthwise and then slice skinny (so they look like half moons)

Put 28 ounces chicken broth to boil in a large kettle. Add potatoes and cook until done.

While potatoes are boiling, brown 1 pound Italian ground sausage and drain

Add 4 cups Kale, 1 teaspoon crushed red pepper, 1 teaspoon minced garlic and the sausage to the kettle.

Add 1 cup cream.( I also added 1 cup water so it was enough broth to look like the soup at Olive Garden.) You could add a little more milk or more broth instead of water.

The kale cooks instantly as you stir it in. VOILA!  
It is absolutely delicious.

Kandee suggested that the sale be held in conjunction with the rummage sale in May. The Board would like to send out an informational mailing to all OSLC members explaining the Scrips program (Refer to the Stewardship February minutes for full report.)

**Bd. of Education:** Stephanie reported that Confirmation will take place on May 8<sup>th</sup>, Mother's Day. The last day of Sunday School will be the following week.. The retreat for the Confirmation students at Camp Amnicon was a success and fun for all. (Refer to the Bd. of Ed. February minutes for full report.)

**Mission & Outreach:** Diana reported the clothes closet needs men's small and medium clothes for Junior High aged kids March food collections will go to the Faith United Methodist pantry. 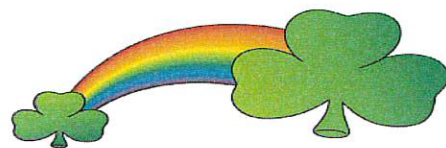
