DEVOTIONS

Think about devotions as a continuation of our community's worship. The following basic pattern could be one way of forming your household's devotions. Adapt as necessary!

GATHERING

✤ Light a candle to help you focus this time as "God time."

✤ Prayer of the Week

Almighty God, through Jesus, you have conquered death and given us hope in your promises of everlasting life. Help us cling to that promise, and give us always glimpses of new life every day. Amen.

CARING CONVERSATION

Take a moment to check in with each other or to use the questions below.

- Highs & Lows: Name one thing that happened today that was exciting. Name one thing that happened that was not exciting.
- Thinking about This Week's Story: Jesus died, was buried, and was raised again so that we may have the promise of everlasting life. God never breaks God's promise to us. Did you promise someone something today? Did you keep it?
- Getting Ready for Next Week's Story: Jesus wants all people to know about the good news of God's love. What good news did you hear today?

DAILY BIBLE READING

Read aloud from the DAILY BIBLE READING from the front. What do you want to remember from this reading?

PRAY TOGETHER

✤ Jesus gives us new life. We should say a prayer of thanks. Have each person say a prayer of thanksgiving.

<u>CLOSING</u>

✤ If you used a candle, extinguish it as a sign of the end of the devotion time.

With permission, mark one another with the sign of the cross on the forehead, and say, "Go forth in peace, filled with the promise that God is with you. Amen."

If your household includes younger children, use a child-friendly Bible. You might find that the children's Bible you are using may not include the very story assigned for the DAILY BIBLE READINGS. **Read to your kids anyway. Just pick a story!**
